



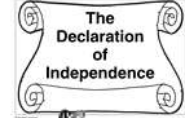

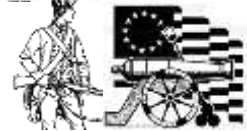
**Hiawatha** was a leader for American Indians.
